PATRIARCHY

Patriarchy is a pattern of society or a system of social administration in which the father or senior male enjoys being the head of the family.



Meaning of patriarchy

- Patriarchy implies male domination, male
 prejudice against women or simply male power.
- In other words the patriarchy term means the absolute rule of the father or the eldest male of family.
- Originally the word patriarchy was used to describe a specific type of male dominated family the large household, which included women, junior men, children, domestic servants, all under the rule of this dominated male

Concept

- Patriarchy literally means the rule of fathers the word patriarchy is derived from Greek word Patria meaning father and arche meaning rule and refers to a society in which male members predominate in positions of power.
- The term patriarchy is also used in system of ranking made leadership in certain religions and customs

In a patriarchal system, men make all decisions both in the family as well as in the society.

In a patriarchal society, women are expected to be obedient and **Submissive** at all times.

- It's Ideology exaggerate biological differences between men and women, making certain that men always have the dominant or masculine roles and women's always have the subordinate of a feminine one.
- It is characterized by power, dominance, hierarchy and competition.

- •Religious: Male dominance is "God given."
- •Biological determinist: "Man is the hunter and dominates."
- Marxist theorist Friedrich Engels: Women become men's "property."
- Anthropologist Claude Levi-Strauss: civilizations manage social relations through the "traffic in women" or the "exchange of women."
- 19th century theorist, Bachofen hypothesized: Matriarchal society preceded patriarchal society in historical time.
- Suffragist Elizabeth Cady Stanton theorized that "maternalist" or mother centered societies existed in some Native American tribes.

ARYERSE EFFECTS

- Patriarchy has shaped cultural attitudes and practices and affects how we think and behave, until we become aware of its presence and challenge it.
- The traditions, rules, and values of patriarchy, from the last six millennia, are often taught or modelled to girls and boys by mothers who believed they were helping their children to survive in a male dominated world.
- Consequently, the glass ceiling is not just outside us (e.g. caring for family still seen as women's priority), it is also within us (e.g. lack of confidence).
- "We all have an inner patriarch who controls us from the inside...from our unconscious." Sidra Stone (Psychotherapist)
- The inner patriarch operates in men as well as women, his voice is the voice of our culture.
